Plans for FY2009

 - ❑ Engage w/ NASVF, NGA, and Industry specific regional organizations to foster new relationships
 - ❑ Create centralized resources for state & local governments to access
 - ❑ Create a list of state & local government contacts for use by the laboratories
 - ❑ Work through and with Regional Coordinators and their support contractors
 - ❑ Facilitate laboratory tours for state and local stakeholders
 - ❑ Evaluate how best to interact with regional SBIR activities
